Members of the Board of School Trustees of the Brownstown Central Community School Corporation met in Regular Session at the Brownstown Central Community School Corporation's Administration Office at 7:30 p.m., on Tuesday, May 14, 2019.

A work session was held at 6:30 p.m. prior to the executive session.

An executive session was held at 7:00 p.m. to discuss personnel as listed in (IC 5-41-1.5-6.1) (b) (5) (6). No subject matters were discussed in Executive Session other than the subject matters specified in the public notice.

Amy Matthews held a public hearing at 7:30 p.m. on Proposed Superintendent Contract in which public comments would be taken. There were no public comments. The hearing was adjourned at 7:34 p.m.
